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#### **MIKE Launches Pilot Program at David Douglas High School**

MIKE is thrilled to launch programming with its newest partner, David Douglas High School (DDHS). MIKE will embed a pilot program in the high school's Health Sciences I class, introducing students to a variety of healthcare career options. DDHS serves more than 2,700 students speaking 44 languages, with almost all qualifying for free/reduced lunches—the defining line for poverty. Based on student surveys, MIKE will bring in a healthcare professionals as guest speakers to provide the students with healthcare career information of greatest interest. By establishing this partnership at DDHS, MIKE is expanding our services to introduce more underserved communities into healthcare career options.



#### MIKE'S Expanded Programming Addresses Mental Health Themes for Students in Beaverton

One of the most effective impacts of MIKE is providing mentored health education that addresses and meets the needs of the students we serve. That's why we build curriculum and programming around the school and students' interests. At the Merlo Station Community School in Beaverton, we surveyed the students to find that they were most interested in covering a comprehensive approach to mental health issues and the impact of tobacco, drugs and alcohol. MIKE's Programs Coordinator Linda Nguyen collaborated with Health Teacher Mark Lea, MIKE Education and Mentoring Committee member and past mentor, Madeleine Takahashi, and current mentor Natasha Astrakhan to develop relevant content for the students. The mentors lead students through discussions and guide them toward resources so they can make more informed decisions about their health.

#### **Sweet Home Students Envision Health in Their Community**


MIKE has long known that high school students offer innovative thinking about health. So, what better way to capture those ideas than with a "My Healthy Sweet Home" poster contest. MIKE created the contest for students in Sweet Home High School's Anatomy & Physiology class as a way to explore health advocacy in their local community. Their poster ideas span an array of ways to encourage their fellow students to lead healthier lives—so we wanted to share!

As we go to print, the entire high school is voting on which posters influence them the most. Following the student vote, a group of Sweet Home health and academic leaders will judge the posters for impactful messaging, design and health content. Coorinating student efforts at SHHS include Kristin Adams, Sweet Home High School Success Cooordinator, and Michelle Synder, Sweet Home High School Science Teacher.
